The Patronal Feast of the Holy Monastery of Sts. Cyprian and Justina

N SATURDAY, 2 October 2005 (Old Style), the Holy Monastery of Sts. Cyprian and Justina in Fili, the headquarters of the Metropolis of Oropos and Fili and also of the Holy Synod in Resistance, celebrated, by the Grace of God, its Patronal Feast.





Observable once again, as is the case every year, was an influx of countless pilgrims coming from many parts of our country and abroad in order to honor the wonder-working and celebrated Patron Saints of the Monastery of Cyprian and Justina, to offer Nameday greetings to its founder and Abbot, His Eminence, Metropolitan Cyprian, and, in general, to be confirmed in the Faith and to sense

Notable visitors from abroad included Hierarchs and clergy of the Holy Synod in Resistance and of its Sister Churches of Romania and Bulgaria.

A large delegation came from Romania, consisting of His Eminence, Metropolitan Vlasie, President of the Holy Synod; Their Graces, Bishops Demosten of Neamţ, Ghenadie of Bacău, Pahomie of Vrancea, Teodosie of Braşov, and Flavian of Ilfov; three Priests, one Hierodeacon, and laypeople.

His Eminence, Bishop Photii of Triaditza came from Bulgaria together with his Secretary, the venerable Monk Euthymius; Mr. Tondoroff, his spiritual child and a former high-ranking political official of the country; and also a fairly large group of pilgrims, along with two Priests and a Deacon.

His Eminence, Metropolitan Vlasie and His Eminence, Bishop Photii of Triaditza also addressed brief messages of greetings.

The participation of the municipal band of Ano Liosia in the procession with the Holy Relics and the Icon of the Saints whose memory was being honored particularly underscored the festal character of this splendid day.
