## A Follow-up to the Missionary Visit\*

As we wrote in a previous issue of our periodical,  $\[Aylog Kv\pi \varrho lav \delta c$ , His Eminence, Metropolitan Cyprian, together with His Grace, Bishop Ambrose of Methoni and two laymen, made a successful missionary visit to our communities in Kenya during the final ten days of this past January.

From among the many expressions of gratitude that we received from our our Orthodox brethren in Kenya following this visit, we are publishing just two representative letters: the first is from Protopresbyter John Njue Njagi, one of our Episcopal Representatives and Rector of the newly-Consecrated Church of the Holy Apostle Paul, in Kaanja, Embu, and the second is from Mother Christonymphe, Superior of the newly-established Convent of the Holy Great Martyr George the Trophy-bearer, near Mount Kenya.

## I. Church of the Apostle Paul, Embu

27 March 2001

## Your Eminence:

I prostrate before you and kiss your right hand, and I ask your forgiveness, I, your lowly and sinful servant, who am not worthy to incline my head over a piece of paper to write to you, unblessed as I am. ...On behalf of the clergy and the Orthodox Faithful of the Eastern Region, we wish to thank



you and those who accompanied you. We do not have words to express our gratitude, for our Church in Kenya has been uplifted more than we can put into words. May the Heavenly Father grant many years to you and your fellow-workers in the Lord's Vineyard.

The Consecration of the Church of the Holy Apostle Paul showed forth the truth of Orthodoxy, which is unknown to the heterodox. For this reason, it strengthened the faith of our Orthodox people. Your visits to different parishes, beginning with the Convent of St. George and the Divine Liturgy that you celebrated there, as well as your paternal counsels, encouraged the Faithful, who long to have you always near them. They say that you have laid the foundation of genuine Orthodoxy here in Kenya. They pray that, God willing, you might visit them again.

Pray for us and send us your blessing, and inform our brothers and sisters in Greece and elsewhere that we rejoiced beyond measure at your visit here and the love that you showed us, at your prayers, and at your material assistance to us.
