New Member of the C.T.O.S. Board of Advisors

ONOCTOBER 25, 2010 (New Style), Ernest Hargreaves Latham, Jr., a former colleague and personal friend of Archbishop Chrysostomos, was appointed to the Board of Advisors of the Center for Traditionalist Orthodox Studies. A well-known educator, historian, author, and American diplomat, he is presently an instructor at the U.S. Department of State's Foreign Service Institute.

Professor Latham has taught at the Lowell Technological Institute (now the North Campus of the University of Massachusetts, Lowell) and, as a Fulbright Scholar and Professor in Romania, at the Babeş-Bolyai University (in Cluj) and the University of Bucharest. He also served in 2001 as Executive Director of the U.S. Fulbright Commission in Romania.

Dr. Latham is a graduate of Dartmouth College and holds graduate degrees from Roosevelt University and the University of Bucharest. He has served in U.S. diplomatic posts in Lebanon, Saudi Arabia, Austria, Cyprus, Germany, Greece, and Romania, and worked as a special assistant to the U.S. Secretary of Defense in the Romanian Military Archives at the Pentagon.

Recipient of a Meritorious Service Award from the U.S. Information Agency, Professor Latham is also a former Commander in the U.S. Coast Guard Reserve. He holds membership in the American Historical Association; the American Association for the Advancement of Slavic Studies; Diplomatic and Consular Officers, Retired; and the Society for Romanian Studies.

Among Professor Latham's notable publications are an entry on Romania in the eleventh edition of the *Encyclopedia Britannica* and numerous historical studies. In addition, his reviews and several monographs on Romanian history and culture have appeared in *Orthodox Tradition* and under the imprint of the Center for Traditionalist Orthodox Studies.
