

HOLY MONASTERY OF SAINTS CYPRIAN AND JUSTINA

For the sake of our English-speaking faithful and Internet readers, we would like to reproduce a photograph of a portion of the brotherhood of the Holy Monastery of Sts. Cyprian and Justina, in Phyle (Athens), Greece, which recently appeared in *Hagios Kyprianos* (St. Cyprian), a Greek language publication of the monastery.



This photograph is rare, since the monastery brotherhood, with clergy who serve and work in our Church's communities throughout Greece, are seldom gathered in one place for a suitable photograph. Pictured are only 30 of the 47 Fathers of the brotherhood. Ten were absent, attending to pastoral duties. Also not in the photograph are the seven brothers (monastic novices) at the monastery.

We have also included recent photographs of the monastery itself: an aerial view of the monastic compound and a view of the monastery *Katholikon* (the major Church, among the numerous Chapels in the mon-

astery), looking from the front doors to the Altar. The magnificent monastery was built largely by the brotherhood itself, with the help of pious laymen, and is still incomplete.





The Monastery of Sts. Cyprian and Justina, with five Bishops in residence, including the ailing First Hierarch of our Church, Metropolitan Cyprian, is the seat of the Metropolis of Oropos and Phyle and the head-quarters of the Holy Synod in Resistance of the Old Calendar Orthodox Church of Greece.
