Let us exorcize grumbling and a negative, fatalistic mentality!

A crisis of any kind constitutes an historic opportunity for a gradual, but radical, change at every level.

Let us become creative and resourceful once again! Let us not allow the multilayered and multifaceted crisis to overwhelm and crush us!

Behind the numbers and statistics are people, and it is they who ultimately determine the numbers: by the renewal of creativity, the revitalization of a society of solidarity, and by self-sacrifice, for the re-establishment of just government, the restoration of institutions and precepts, and consistent recognition of the dignity of our neighbor.

Let us intensify our hopeful prayers and our creative repentance!

May Christ enlighten the spiritual, political, and economic leadership of our country, such that it might give rise to vision, hope, and creativity!

The time has come, under the

boundless light of the Holy Theophany, for us to move from being a Greece of misery and international untrustworthiness to a Greece of creation—a Greece worthy of its civilization and history.

May Divine Providence now bless that our homeland decisively embark on a positive and utterly restored course!

"And instead of the [shrubby] bramble shall come up the [lofty] cypress, and instead of the [fetid] nettle shall come up the [fragrant] myrtle" (Isaiah 55:13).

May the holy prayers of our much revered Elder, Metropolitan Cyprian of Oropos and Phyle, protect us, along with the blessing of the venerable members of our Holy Synod in Resistance of the Old Calendar Orthodox Church.

Finally, we feel the need, as we do every year, to thank most warmly all of those participating today in this radiant Feast of our Church and Nation, and in particular the holy Hierarchs and Priests from abroad, the
