Pastoral Visit to the Holy Land of Georgia August 11-18, 2022 (Old Style)



Uagia Portaïtissa and of St. Nina, the Enlightener of Iberia (Georgia), His Eminence, Metropolitan Cyprian of Oropos and Phyle, in his capacity as *Locum Tenens* of the Holy Diocese of Gldani, made his cus-

tomary summer pastoral visit to Georgia from August 11 to 18, 2022 (Old Style).

The central event of this visit was the Hierarchical Divine Liturgy on the Great Feast of the Dormition of the Theotokos, which was celebrated at the Cathedral Church of the *Panagia Portaïtissa*, located in Gldani, Tbilisi.

During the Divine Liturgy, with the participation of all of the clergy (the Reverend Fathers Basili Mkalavishvili and Vakhtang

Mariani, Hieromonks Grigol and Alexei, and Deacon Father Giorgi Achelashvili), several Subdeacons, and a large throng of faithful, there took place:

• the *cheirothesia* (laying on of hands) for service in the Church of seven Subdeacons and five chanters;





• the ordination to the Diaconate of Andria Daneliya, who will serve the community of faithful in Poti (western Georgia) that has existed for some twenty-five years.

• the Ordination to the Priesthood

of Deacon Father Giorgi (grandson of the Episcopal Representative, Father Basili Mkalavishvili), who will serve the parish of the *Panagia Portaïtissa*; and

• the baptism of baby Tatiana, great-granddaughter of Father Basili.

During this pastoral visit, Metropolitan Cyprian participated in Divine Liturgies (at the Church of All Saints of Georgia and the *Hesychasterion* of the



Prophetess Anna), met with the clergy and individual members of the faithful in order to address various issues, and held a monastic *Synaxis*.

His Eminence and his travelling companions also made several pilgrimages, particularly in the footsteps of St. Nina, who has been designated as the special protectress of the pastoral work in the sanctified land of Georgia.
